Bonus Point (Optional)	Reviewers may award a bonus point if the applicant submitted a letter of recommendation (as an extra along with the recommendation form a) from someone other than a current classroom teacher or PSOC. Letters from teachers commenting on classroom performance will not be accepted. Letters from teachers who know you in the context of a club or sport are acceptable. This person highly recommends the student for a scholarship. Note: One bonus point is optional and does not need to be awarded.
